Frances Ortiz began her early dance training in San Juan, Puerto Rico, and went on to study at the New World School of the Arts in Miami, FL. She earned her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance from Purchase College, SUNY, and received full scholarships to prestigious institutions including The Alvin Ailey American Dance School, The José Limón Dance Institute, The Martha Graham School, and Dance Theatre of Harlem.

Ms. Ortiz earned a Master of Arts in Dance in Higher Education from New York University, where she was honored with the award for Outstanding Achievement in Choreography. She is a co-founder of Thomas/Ortiz Dance, and currently serves as Partner and Co-Artistic Director at the New England Academy of Dance and its non-profit performance arm, New England Dance Theater.

She is a Certified Teacher in the ABT® National Training Curriculum and the Cecchetti method, and is passionate about inspiring young dancers through her teaching. In 2023, Ms. Ortiz received the Connecticut Fellowship Award for Artistic Excellence in Dance and Choreography. She is also a CT certified teacher and has taught at Greenwich High School for 24 years.

Ginna Ortiz, a native of San Juan, Puerto Rico, began her training at the New World School of the Arts in Miami, FL, where she attended on full scholarship. She earned her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Ballet from Purchase College, SUNY, and was recognized with the VP Award for Outstanding Contribution to the Quality of Student Life. Ms. Ortiz was awarded scholarships to study with the Richmond Ballet and Dance Theatre of Harlem, where she later joined the company under the direction of Arthur Mitchell. With DTH, she toured internationally performing renowned classical and contemporary works such as Firebird, Dougla, Forces of Rhythm, Serenade, Concerto Barocco, Western Symphony, and worked with leading artists including Suzanne Farrell, Robert Garland, Charmaine Hunter, Christina Johnson and Alicia Graf.

A founding member of Thomas/Ortiz Dance, she performed and served as rehearsal director before joining NEAD in 2003. Ms. Ortiz is certified in ABT® Cecchetti ballet and trained in both the Vaganova and Balanchine styles. She is currently Partner and Co-Artistic Director at NEAD and New England Dance Theater.

Ted Thomas began his dance training at the Bernice Johnson Cultural Arts Center in Queens, NY, and later studied at LaGuardia High School for the Performing Arts. He continued his training with The Alvin Ailey American Dance School, The Joffrey Ballet School, and Dance Theatre of Harlem, and earned his Bachelor of Fine Arts from Purchase College, followed by a Master of Arts in Dance in Higher Education from New York University.

Mr. Thomas has performed with leading dance companies including the Paul Taylor Dance Company—featured in the Academy Award—nominated film Dancemaker—as well as Elisa Monte Dance Company, Ballet Hispanico of New York, Nikolais & Louis Dance Company, and Rebecca Kelly Ballet. He is a recipient of the Princess Grace Award and has taught at Barnard College, NYU, and other institutions, mentoring and choreographing for emerging dancers.

He is an ABT® National Training Curriculum Certified Teacher and Connecticut State Certified Educator. Mr. Thomas is a Partner, Director, and Instructor at the New England Academy of Dance, and co-founder of the Fairfield County Dance Festival, where he brings his wealth of performance and teaching experience to our region uear round.

CHRISTINA FAGUNDES TURNER



Christina Fagundes Turner began her twenty-five year professional career with San Francisco Ballet in 1982, where she was featured in several KQED televised productions. In 1985 Baryshnikov invited her to join American Ballet Theater and appointed her as soloist in 1989 where her repertoire included principal roles in all the 19th century classics. In 1999, she was a founding member of Suzanne Farrell Ballet dancing Gems by Balanchine and Bejart. She has a private studio, is a ballet mistress for Connecticut Ballet, and is on faculty at NEAD where she collaborated with NSO in 2019. Ms. Turner graduated summa cum laude with a B. F. A. from Fordham University, is a certified ABT teacher who believes ballet enriches our soul.

AMY MARSHALL



Amy Marshall co-founded the Amy Marshall Dance Company (AMDC) in 2000 with Chad Levy. She has created over 30 works and set repertory for universities and companies across the U.S., while also leading master classes, workshops, and residencies internationally. AMDC has toured in Poland, Mexico, China, and throughout the U.S., with a strong emphasis on education and outreach. Marshall has served as a mentor through panels like the American College Dance Festival and the South Carolina Dance Association.

She holds an M.S. in Sports Science from Hofstra University and a B.A. in Dance and Theater from Goucher College. She taught at Hofstra from 2003–2025 and has held faculty positions at Adelphi, the Hartt School, the Taylor School, and Peridance. A Certified Sports Nutritionist and Personal Trainer, Marshall integrates dance, education, and fitness to promote personal and professional growth. She is currently the Associate Director of Education at the Paul Taylor Dance Company.

Charles Scheland is a company dancer of Carolyn Dorfman Dance and a seasonal dancer of Michael Spencer Phillips' Site-Specific Dances. He previously danced for RIOULT Dance NY, Michael Mao Dance, and has been a guest artist with Buglisi Dance Theater, Princeton Dance Theater, and Alison Cook-Beatty Dance. Charles has performed works by Alvin Ailey, Robert Battle, Adam Barruch, Clifton Brown, Christina Fagundes, Amy Hall Garner, Adrienne Hurd, Bill T. Jones, Juel Lane, Jessica Lang, Milton Myers, Elizabeth Roxas, Paul Taylor, and others. He graduated summa cum laude from the Ailey/Fordham BFA in Dance program with a double major in Dance and Economics with departmental honors in both majors.

2025 is his 7th year as a guest artist with NEDT/NEAD, including roles such as Rothbart in Swan Lake, Pas de Trois in Paquita, Demetrius in A Midsummer Night's Dream, and the Nutcracker Prince.

Charles is an expert of the Lester Horton technique and certified Ailey Horton Technique instructor. He is on faculty at The Ailey School, Steps on Broadway, Kanyok Arts Initiative, and the School at Jacob's Pillow. Additionally, he has worked as Milton Myers' assistant and demonstrator since 2019. He is also a guest teacher at NEAD and rehearsal assistant.

Outside of the dance studio, Charles works for Dance ICONS as the Executive Assistant, and was the Research Associate on the recent book You, the Choreographer, by Vladimir Angelov, published by Routledge. @cschels



William Herrera Gutiérrez is a ballet dancer and teacher from Managua, Nicaragua. He started dancing in the Gran ballet Quezalnahuatl, a traditional Nicaraguan dance company at the age of 9 and started ballet professionally at the age of 15. After graduating start dancing profesionally in the Compañía Ballet de Nicaragua under direction of William Herrera as a soloist dancer quickly becoming a principal dancer, interpretating leading roles in the classical repertoire and contemporary works by Eduardo Blanco. Joined Mustic Ballet in 2013 performing leading roles of classical repertoire and contemporary works by Sergei Vanaev, Gabrielle Lamb, Laura Edson and Austin Mckormick. He has been guest principal dancer in companies in central america performing classicals as Nutcracker, Carmen, Bayadere, Swan Lake and worked in the nutcracker production in Costa Rica under the direction of the former American Ballet Principal Wes Chapman. In 2022 was invited to join the company as soloist where he has been performing leading roles of classical repetitions of Nutcracker, Bayadere and Giselle by Michal Štipa and leading roles in contemporary works Solo for three by Pter Zuska, Bolero by Riccardo de Nigris and Blood wedding by Alena Peškova. He has performed in several galas around the world in Germany, Serbia, Hungary, USA, El Salvador, Costa Rica, Nicaragua and Panamá. In 2024 he joined East Coast Contemporary Ballet


Andrew Demakakos, a native of Astoria, Queens, began dancing at Callina's School of Dance and later attended the Professional Performing Arts School, majoring in dance. He trained at Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater and studied with Kristen McGrew, Pedro Ruiz, and Lisa Hurd. In high school, he performed with KTB Dance and Drama for two seasons and studied at Harlem School of the Arts. He also attended two summer intensives at The Rock School in Philadelphia. Andrew earned his BFA in Dance with a ballet concentration from the Conservatory of Dance at Purchase College in 2023, where he performed works by Eve Chan, Michelle Ulrich Thompson, Christopher Rudd, and George Balanchine's Serenade. He currently dances with Madison Ballet and recently showcased his choreography Rollercoaster of Love at Steps on Broadway's Performance Lab. His goal is to expand the boundaries of ballet through his passion and artistry.



Michael Requena began his studies in 2005 at the Gustavo Franklin Foundation Ballet Art School in Caracas, Venezuela. In 2014 he received a scholarship to study with the Joffrey Concert Group in New York City, directed by Davis Robertson and Nicole Duffy. Michael was a gold medal winner in the International Classical Ballet Competition (CIBC) advanced category in 2015. Additionally, he had the opportunity to work for professional companies such as the National ballet Of Venezuela (Ballet Teresa Carreño), New World Ballet of Caracas, Contemporary Ballet of Caracas, and the Contemporary Ballet of the San Martín Theater in Buenos Aires, Argentina.



Santiago Jimenez Vargas Born in Colombia, Santiago started his artistic knowlege at the age of 15. He started training at Ballet Anna pavlova as same in a special program with the Julio Mario Santo Domingo Theater in Bogota. "Alma en Movimiento"; where he improved his technical skills to become a professional dancer. In 2018 he was offered a full scholarship with Ballet Academy East in NYC where he graduated in 2020. During the time he studied at Ballet Academy East he has worked with famous choreographers and coaches as Darla Hoover, Lia Ciro, Alan Hineline, Silas Farley, Maina Gielgud, Ariel Rose and others. In 2021 Santiago joined Ballet de Barcelona as an apprentice. He has been casted in leading and featured roles for such performances as "Valse Fantasie" of George Balanchine, Romanza by Alan Hiline, In excelsis by Silas Farley, and A Midsummer Night's Dream by George Balanchine.
