YEAR IN REVIEW Letter from Chair of the Board

Fall 2024

Dear Friends of New England Dance Theater,

On behalf of the NEDT board, I'm proud to share our second Annual Report highlighting our work and its impact that stems from your generous support. Our mission is to create greater access, awareness, and appreciation of dance, which relies on the thoughtful financial contributions from our donors, countless hours and high energy from our dedicated volunteers, and the confidence and guidance in our partnership with grant funders.

We are mission-focused in three key areas: high-quality productions, community outreach, and dancer enrichment.

This year, we continued many of our signature programs and partnerships, including the Summer Dance Camp at The Carver Center, our weekly STAR Dance Classes, live accompaniment with the Norwalk Symphony Orchestra in collaboration with our Nuteracker production, and so much more. Specifically, I'd like to highlight several new or expanded initiatives accomplished this year that exemplify our commitment to our mission.

Lecture-Demonstrations Reached 1,500+ Patrons

We expanded our lecture-demonstration community performances this past year with a resounding response from young and old alike. We raised NEDT and the arts awareness with exposure to more than 1,500 patrons at 10 different venues in Stamford, New Canaan, Norwalk, and Pound Ridge (NY), including Waveny Care Center, Pound Ridge Nursery School, ATRIA Senior Center, the New Canaan Inn, among others.

New Canaan Library Shares Support for the Performing Arts

In September 2023, the New Canaan Library, Stand Together Against Racism (S.T.A.R.), and the New England Academy of Dance (NEAD) partnered to screen professional ballerina Misty Copeland's short episodic film, *Flower*. The panel presentation with famed ballet recognition was a sold-out event and included more than 100 of our ballerinas in attendance. In December, we brought our ballerinas into the Library's Jim & Dede Bartlett Auditorium to showcase *Nuturuker* excerpts to an audience of more than 250 patrons. Then, this spring, we kicked off the Library's first live performance on the Green (a fantastic new sprawling lawn in the middle of town!) with our competition dancers on our new outdoor stage (purchased during the pandemic), also attracting more than 250 audience members of all ages. *(continued on next page)*

Enrichment: New Dancer Development Program

NEDT launched a new Dancer Development program partnering with NEAD to bring special workshops and seminars to dancers in Ballet 1 and above (ages 6+). Workshops included a hands-on tutorial on making the perfect ballet buns, applying stage makeup, useful approaches to help injury prevention, and a very special Ballerina Bedtime Stories event for our youngest dancers. We are proud that NEDT can directly impact many NEAD dancers with enrichment opportunities.

Insuring Our Most Valuable Assets

NEDT partnered with the school's building owners, the Harmony Lodge #67-New Canaan Masons, to renovate our costume closet. NEDT owns and maintains hundreds of beautiful costumes, and this renovation ensured that they would be stored in the best possible conditions. We are grateful for the support of our 30 generous donors, who sponsored a tutu storage drawer as our fundraiser for this important initiative. We are excited to start the new school year with this beautiful and safe new space for the tutus and all who access it.

This past year was a great success, made possible by YOU—our generous supporters. Thank you for believing in our mission and igniting our work through your donations, time, love for the performing arts, and our blossoming ballerinas!





FINANCIAL 2023-SUMMARY 2024

NEDT had another robust year of programming resulting in financial stability for our organization. Our financial results were consistent with last year's with strong revenue driven by more strategic fundraising efforts and careful management of our expenses. The success of our Annual Appeal raised critical funds for the significant expense of the live professional orchestra for the *Nutcracker* performances. Our grant partners support our extensive community outreach efforts. NEDT also had significant restricted gifts and expenses for scholarships and our costume closet renovation. We end this fiscal year with a small surplus allowing us to rebuild our cash reserve which was depleted during the pandemic. The following represents the year-end financials as of 8/14/24.

MISSION DRIVEN HIGH QUALITY PRODUCTIONS

NEDT supported NEAD's December 2023 production of the *Nutcracker* and June 2024 productions of *Cinderella* and *Once Upon a Time*. NEDT underwrites these productions to keep ticket prices affordable for our ballet school and the broader community.

LIVE ORCHESTRA

Collaborated with the Norwalk Symphony Orchestra, which has more than 35 musicians, to provide live accompaniment for four full-length *Nuteracker* performances.

TOWN SUPPORT

Partnered with the New Canaan High School for full use of its state-of-the-art auditorium as our venue for the Nutcracker, Cinderella, and Once Upon a Time.

COSTUME INVESTMENTS

- Debuted new costumes for the Marzipan and Flute roles in 2023
 Nuteracker (purchased last fiscal year).
- Curated and purchased new costumes for the roles of Cinderella, the Fairies, both Stepsisters and Stepmother for the spring *Cinderella* performance.



MISSION DRIVEN COMMUNITY OUTREACH

NEDT believes that everyone, regardless of age, ability or financial status, should have access to see and enjoy live dance.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Provided over 200 complimentary tickets to the Nutcracker performances and another 200 tickets to the two performances of Cinderella in partnership with other local organizations that serve senior citizens, adults with disabilities, and children from under-resourced schools and programs.
- Provided free access to three Nuteracker performances via live stream, accessed by 15 organizations, and reached over 275 people in our local communities.
- Returned to several senior centers and the New Canaan Library to share the magic of the Nutcracker by performing excerpts of productions with their residents and the local community.
- In partnership with the New Canaan Library, we presented the first outdoor performance on the Library's new outdoor Green Lawn space, utilizing our outdoor stage with an audience of over 250 patrons.
- Sponsored the outdoor stage in 2023 for the Fairfield Summer Dance Festival, offering performance opportunities to NEAD dancers and other guest dancers.
- In July and August 2023, we sponsored our annual Summer Dance Program at the Carver Center in Norwalk, making a significant impact by providing six weeks of dance instruction to 30 students each week.
- Consistently taught adaptive dance classes in person, in-studio for local nonprofit, STAR, Inc., serving 10-15 adults with disabilities each week, demonstrating our ongoing commitment to this community.







MISSION DRIVEN DANCER ENRICHMENT

NEDT provides numerous enrichment opportunities for NEAD dancers each year, knowing that exposing dancers to a diversity of influence helps encourage both personal and artistic growth.

- Doris Driver Scholarship awarded financial gifts to five dancers to support their continued study of dance over the summer months
 - Dancer Development workshops reaching over 110 dancers in Ballet 1 and above on topics ranging from bun making to stage makeup to injury prevention.
